ALL DAY WORKSHOPS Environmental Compliance Inspector Training

This one-day training conducted on Tuesday is geared toward both new and seasoned inspectors as well as anyone who deals with on-site visits to industrial or commercial facilities. California Highway Patrol Officer John Wilson will conduct training modeled on how police officers are trained to react to unknown and unpredictable encounters with individuals who may not welcome government "interference." The 2000 San Leandro inspector murders will be discussed in this all day session to assist inspectors to overcome the "fight, flight or comply" reaction.

EPA Basic Pretreatment Training

Always innovative and engaging, Keith Silva, Greg Arthur, and Anna Yen, the U.S. EPA Region IX, will provide comprehensive training for newcomers to the pretreatment field and those veterans who are returning for a refresher. The trainers will provide the tools needed to start and operate a successful Pretreatment Program. They'll also give their insights and updates to the National Pretreatment Program. This session is always jam packed so arrive early!

Fats, Oil, and Grease Control Program Training

Cal FOG's popular training course led by John Shaffer, Environmental Engineering and Contracting (EEC), is always up-to-date with the latest technical information for those starting a FOG program or wanting to enhance a current FOG program. This class provides an excellent

overview of FOG basics and advanced techniques to improve existing FOG programs. The workshop also provides field training related to grease interceptor inspection and cleaning. Be sure to register for this session, so you are able to participate in the hands-on exercises.

Storm Water Treatment 101 Training

Scott Taylor, RBF Consulting, is leading the first Storm Water Treatment 101 Training at a P3S Conference in the south. This all-day training session will begin with an introduction to storm water quality issues, and provide information on infiltration design, low impact development best management practices design, and emerging best management practices. The course is designed to give participants an overview of the basic treatment tools used by land development and municipal storm water managers to comply with storm water NPDES permit requirements. The session on new and emerging BMPs will reflect the requirements in recent NPDES permits as well as contemporary research.
