Brian was born and raised in Weaverville and graduated with a degree in Civil Engineering from the University of California at Davis.

She has been nominated for the Intertribal Council of Arizona's Operator of the Year for her commitment to the health of her facility and to serving her community.

Larry Olivan has been a licensed private investigator for 20 years. He's worked in Oro Loma for 15 years and is a retired police officer.

Christopher Pendergrass, CSP, OHST is a Certified Safety Professional with over 15 years experience in safety/industrial hygiene, water/wastewater/energy operations, training, emergency operations, hazardous materials response, critical infrastructure protection, and incident investigation/event analysis. Mr. Pendergrass provides practical strategies for deploying effective workplace safety training and safety management systems.
