

We followed the tour with a delicious dinner by Sol Agave, just down the street, catching up with familiar faces and meeting new ones.



Industrial Tour of the Reyes Coca Cola

The Coca-Cola Tour began with representative staff presenting their goals on community engagement, recycling, solar installation in their facilities, plans to reduce greenhouse gases and emissions, and lastly their efforts in reducing water consumption. Staff explained the process of converting green bottles to clear plastic bottles for the following products: Dasani, Sprite, Fresca, Sea Grams and Yellow Mellow. 100% of the bottles for Coca-Cola and Coke Zero and Diet Coke are recyclable using rPET. Coca Cola walked the LABS members throughout the plant to observe the bottling process, movement of goods, and see the treatment facility. The final part of the tour highlighted the new electrified fleet trucks that were going to hit the public the following week. Overall, this tour taught our CWEA attendees about the many steps corporations are taking to put in place environmental practices in their day-to-day production.
